# Message from the Chair and Chair-Elect

September is Women in Medicine Month and WICTA would like to honor the women in cardiothoracic anesthesiology and our professional women colleagues throughout medicine.

The pandemic of the last year and a half has necessitated many women, in addition to their professional work, to take on even more domestic responsibilities, whether childcare responsibilities or care for aging, fragile family members. Increased clinical workloads either due to COVID directly or due to the backlog in care produced by the pandemic often added to the burden. In addition, women in our field have continued to navigate gender bias, inflexible and often family-unfriendly work schedules as they tried to stay focused on their jobs and advance themselves professionally.

Many women, sadly, have left our field, feeling too overwhelmed and unsupported in their professional environments. Rates of burnout, depression, and even suicide have all been documented to be higher in women physicians.

As a result, the need to support women and address professional barriers and bias is even more critical today than it has been in the past. Recognizing this, WICTA and its membership has stayed focused on our mission to promote DEI in our field through the recruitment, development, and promotion of women and under-represented minority physicians as leaders in cardiothoracic anesthesiology.

With that in mind, we would like to take this moment to reflect on some important accomplishments in the last year and a half. WICTA has:

- Created virtual happy hour networking events
- Worked with the SCA research committee to launch an SCA-research grant for women and underrepresented minorities in medicine
- Developed and launched two Peer
  Development Mentoring Programs:
  In 2020, a program for women seeking
  professional speaking skills and this year,



a program for women looking for mentorship and skills to develop research projects. There have been 4 excellent webinars for all WICTA members to participate in and learn from

- Built a speaker database that has already begun to connect women to professional speaking opportunities
- Provided community and a resource for over 300 women in CT anesthesiology who are looking for a meaningful way to engage with the SCA, including a way to connect with potential collaborators at other institutions or learn about available leadership positions, awards, and grant opportunities.

While change is often slow and may be hard to see as we all are busy in our own personal and professional spheres, we want to highlight a remarkable trend in the last 2 years: the increased involvement and visibility of women in the SCA leadership.

Since 2019, the percentage of SCA Leadership committees that had significant proportions of women have doubled. While WICTA was only part of this story, it is an impressive reminder that impactful change is possible and in our reach.

Great things happen when you give women visibility, a community, and a voice. Thank you all for your amazing work!




