The <u>mission</u> of the Health Equity and Professional Advancement Committee (HEPAC) is to advance health equity and foster inclusive leadership and career development within perioperative cardiovascular medicine by championing a deeper understanding of the unique experiences and perspectives of clinicians, patients, and communities.

HEPAC aims to cultivate a professional environment that supports excellence, representation, and meaningful engagement at all levels of practice.

The goals of the Health Equity and Professional Advancement Committee (HEPAC) are:

- 1. Develop and implement strategic initiatives to broaden access and participation within SCA membership, leadership, and training programs, advancing equitable representation and cultivating leadership throughout the organization.
- 2. Support and disseminate rigorous, evidence-based research that examines disparities in perioperative cardiovascular care, with a focus on improving access, outcomes, and representation across patient and provider populations.
- 3. Identify and strengthen partnerships with pipeline programs and communities to broaden exposure to careers in cardiovascular anesthesiology and support a more representative workforce.
- 4. Develop and strengthen mentorship and sponsorship pathways that support career development and leadership opportunities for individuals from all backgrounds, contributing to the future of perioperative cardiovascular medicine.
- 5. Nurture and strengthen community engagement by fostering mutual understanding, promoting inclusive narratives, and advocating for equity through strategic communication, outreach platforms, and other media initiatives.
